Ants in Earlham Cemetery

On 1st September 2012 Doreen Wells, Norfolk County Ant Recorder, visited Earlham Cemetery to record ants. Her findings were as follows:

Earlham Cemetery was a productive site and four ant species were recorded: <u>Formica fusca</u>, <u>Lasius flavus</u>, <u>Lasius niger</u> and <u>Myrmica</u> <u>scabrinodis</u>. Good habitat in a cemetery usually has these species nesting.

The recording sampled different habitats in the cemetery, so it was a representative sample, rather than a comprehensive survey. The survey was confined to the western part of the eastern section. Ants were widespread in the area covered.
